Indigo America Takes.

Calcutta Despatch to the London Times.

The report on the indigo season just closed describes it as one of special interest. The opening of the season was rather dull. Prices fell till about the middle of January, when they began to recover. A distinguishing feature was the large demand from America, which took about 10,000 chests. Russia, contrary to its usual custom, took very little of the best marks; France about as much as usual, Germany less, but London more. The decline in prices is attributed to the largely increased production of indigo in Java. As regards quality it is stated that many Bengal and Benares marks are decidedly inferior, but those from Purneah and Bhawulpore about an average, while the produce of Benard Oude is superior to the average.


