DEEPENING THE MERSEY.

LIVERPOOL, June 21.—The trial took place

LIVERPOOL, June 21.—The trial took place in the River Mersey to-day of a new dredger, which is the largest in the world. It is 320 feet in length, and it is calculated that it will raise 24,000 tons of matter daily from the bar at the mouth of the river. The process of filling and emptying the dredger occupied an hour and a half, and the machine in every way fulfilled expectations.

The work of deepening the water on the bar is done under the direction of the Mersey Docks and Harbor Board, and within the past two years a difference of seven feet in the water on the bar has been obtained. In the early part of 1891 there was only 11 feet of water on the bar at low tide, whereas vessels drawing close on to 18 feet can cross the bar now at low water.
