

Why Hair Turns Gray.

Hundreds of queer theories have been advanced to account for the phenomenon of hair turning grey in the genus homo, the latest being this: Each hair is a hollow tube latest being whis: Each hair is a hollow tube filled with granules of pigment and air bub-bles as old age approaches the pigment diminishes botk in quantity and quality, the air bubbles, enlarging and expanding to take the place formerly occupied by the coloring matter. The hair which is filled with these bubbles turns white for the same reason that the orystals of white sugar ap-pear of that color, the phenoinenon being due to the reflection and refraction of light. Why hair, gometimes turns 3 white in a single night has never been explained. True, a microscopic examination of such hairs shows that that the granules of pig-ment have either been abolished or forced out by the air bubbles, but exactly why or how is a mystery.



The Bridgs Got Mixed.




