The Making of Money.
In point of fitness of workmanship, delicacy and beauty of finish and accuracy of counterfeiting, says the Washington Critic, the bank note engraving turned out by the American engravers is not equaled by the work of any engravers in the world.

The Bank notes, greenback, bonds, revenue certificates, and gold certificates and various stamps used by the United States are printed at the United States bureau of engraving and printing in this city.

The denominations of silver certificates are \$1, \$2 and \$10. The \$10 certificate is adorned with the portrait of the late Thomas A. Hendricks, set in a square panel, an entirely new design in bank note printing.

All the notes are profusely with the work consisting of designs composed of curved lines of geometrical precision made on a machine. A large cost \$5,000 and upward, and cannot be bought by irresponsible parties.

The bureau has a staff of engraving representing a selection from the skill of the country. They are paid salaries of \$80 a day and upward, and are sure of life-long employment as long as they preserve their skill.

Plates for several notes are made on one large sheet of steel, so that a number of notes can be printed with one impression. The printer has a young assistant, who feeds the press and takes out the work, carefully examining each piece for defects.

The paper upon which the bank notes are printed is of a peculiar texture. It is made in a mill at Dalton, Mass., prepared over by government officials.

Each printer is furnished with a blank pass every morning and on the returned number of the sheet given him, the number returns, and a half dozen people affix their initials to the pass, showing the correct return of the paper.

This pass is shown the captain of the

watch at the door when the printer quits work, and he is not allowed to leave the building unless the pass is filled out. The printed money, the unprinted sheets and all drawn plates are turned over to the custodian of the vault each evening and he receipts for them.
