For the delivery of the following quantities of coal at the sheds of the Institutions named on or before the 1st July, 1880, as follows:—

- Asylum for the Insane, Toronto. 850 tons hard coal, large egg; 200 tons hard coal, stove size; 300 tons soft coal.
Central Prison, Toronto. 600 tons soft coal, 50 tons hard coal, stove size.
Andrew Mercer Reformatory for Females, Toronto. 450 tons soft coal, 50 tons hard coal, stove size.

Institution for the Blind, Brantford.

400 tons soft coal, 200 tons hard coal, stove size. The hard coal to be either Pittston, Scranton or Lehigh.
