An attractive story, explaining away many of the doubts and perplexities that arise in the minds of young persons as to what a Christian is, and showing, by the daily life of the pupils of Locust Hill Cottage, how easy it is to become one of God's children and lead a Christian life.

(Third volume of People's Commentary Series. By Rev. Edwin W. Rice, D.D. 12mo, illustrated; 330 pages. Price, by mail, \$1.25, net. This being a companion volume to People's Commentary on Matthew, and Pictorial Commentary on Mark, will like them contain the text of the Authorized and Revised Versions in parallel columns; an introduction to the Gospel and to the Synoptic Gospels; suggestive applications, complete index, maps, illustrations, etc. It is written in a scholarly manner, and is thoroughly evangelical and non-sectarian in its teaching. As the International Series of Lessons for the entire year of 1890 are taken from the Gospel of Luke, this book will have a double value, as a help to the study of the lessons and a permanent commentary.
