the University, was past-president of the Medico-Chirurgical Society of Montreal, and a member of the Medical Board of the Province of Quebec. In the latter, his sterling integrity and honesty of purpose, combined with rare social qualities, made him respected and liked by all, both French and English.

To his personal friends, the removal of "Tom" is a grievous loss. Some men belong to a type, and there seems not much difficulty in replacing them: but there has been only one "Tom Rodger."

DR. R. T. GODFREY.

It is with deep regret that we have to record the death of Dr. R. T. Godfrey of this city, at the age of seventy-two years. Dr. Godfrey was for upwards of forty years one of the leading family physicians in Montreal. His kind and genial manner endeared him to many thousands, and few deaths among the profession in this city have caused a more widespread and keener regret. For many years he occupied the position of Surgeon to the Montreal General Hespital, and for some time he was Professor of Hygiene in McGill University. For upwards of two years he has been in failing health, and recently was compelled to give up all professional work.
