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PROFANE JESTING:
EREMY TAYLOR, one of the most oloquent writers of the English language, rich in im. aginston, fervent in fealiog copious and fotcible in worde has the following striking pass age about profane jésting
"But of all the abuses which elor dishonoured the tongues of men Ho thing more deserves the whip of an externinding angel, or the sting of scorpions, than profane jesting; which is a bringing of the Spirit of God to partake of 'the follies of a man; as' if it were not enough for a man to be a fool, but the wisdom of God must be brought into .those honrible scenes. He that makes jest of the words of Scripture' or of holy things, plays with thuinder, and kisses the mouth of a cannjn' juist as it belches fire and death; he stazees heaven at spurn-point, and tripsi crózis and pile,* whether ever he shall "jee the face of God or no; he laughs"at damnation, while he had rather' losie God than lose his jest; nay (which is the horror of all), he makes a jest' of God himself, and the Spirit of the Father and the Soa to become ridiculous. Some men used to read Scripture on their knees, and many with their heads uncovered, and all good men'with fear and trembling, with reverence and grave attention. 'Search the Scriptures, for therein ve hope to have life eternal,' and 'All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is fit for instruction, for reproof, for exhortation, for doctrine,' not for jesting; but he thäti makes that use of it, had better part with his eyes in jest, and give his heart to make a tennis-ball."
Those burning wórds of Jeremy Taylor against profane jesting should be laid to heart by all who have let themselves fall into the way of using Scripture words lightly.
