of the Colonies. The eloquent Governor Livingston, was the chief writer and editor of these articles; and the controversy certainly prepared the minds of many for the stand, afterwards taken in the revolution, which established the independence of the United States—Drs. Rogers, Laidly, and Mason, were of the association."

We live in more liberal and more enlightened times. I trust our poly will partake of the spirit of the age, and that not acting in opposition to the natural propensities of the people, but on the contrary, founding its operations on these, it will raise up a body of men, a blessing to those, whose devotions they direct, and a firm bond of union between Canada and Great Britain.

The length of Mr. Rac's excellent letter, prevents us from

THE CHURCH OF SCOTLAND, PREVIOUS TO THE YEAR 1750.

Of the 833 benefices which are in Scotland, separating what is allowed for communion-elements, there is one under 25l. sterling; three above 25% and not higher than 30%; twelve above 30% and not higher than 35l.; twenty-five above 35l. and not higher than 40l.; one hundred and six above 40l, and not higher than 45l.; one hundred and twenty-six above 45l. and not higher than 50l.; eighty-four above 50l. and not higher than 55l.; one hundred and nineteen above 55l. and not higher than 60l.; ninety-four above 60l. and not higher than 651.; one hundred and nineteen above 651, and not higher than 701.; thirty-eight above 70l. and not higher than 75l.; twenty-seven above 75l. and not higher than 80l.; twenty-two above 80l. and not higher than 851.; seven above 851. and not higher than 901.; nine above 901. and not higher than 95l.; twelve above 95l, and not higher than 100l.; three above 100l. and not higher than 105l.; two above 105l. and not higher than 1101.; eight above 1101. and not higher than 1151.; sixteen of 1381. 17s. 9d., and 4-6ths; and that the total of these benefices, deducting what is upon the whole allowed for communion-elements, amounts to 502,6611. 15s. 5d. and 10-12ths; and in these, are included stipends that are not paid out of the tithes. And it is to be observed, that 65 are under the present legal minimum of 500 marks, or 441. 8s. 10d. and 2-3ds sterling; and one hundred and eighty-two have no allowance for communion-elements,-Elgin Courier.
