## THE CHURCH OF SCOTLAND, PREviOUS TO THE YEAM 1750.

Of the 833 bencfices which are in Scothand, separating what is allowed for communion-elements, there is one under 25l. sterling; three above 251. and not higher than 301 ; twelve above $30 l$. and not higher than 35l. ; twenty-five above 351 . and not higher than 4.0l. ; one hundred and six above 40l. and not higher than 45l.; one hundred and twenty-six above $45 l$. and not liggier than $50 l$ : cighty-four above 50l. and not higher than 55l; ; one humdred and nincteen above 55l. and not higher than 60l.; nincty-four above 60l. and not higher than 651. ; one hundred and nineteen above 65l. and not higher than 70l.; thirty-eight above 70l. and not higher than 75l.; twenty-seven above 75l. and not higher than 80l.; twenty-two above sol. and not higher than 851 . ; seven above 85l. and not higher than 90l. nine above 901 . and not higher than $95 l$.; twelve above 951 . and not higher than 1001.; three above 100l. and not higher than 105l.; two above 105l. and not higher than 110l.; cight above 110l. and not higher than 115l.; sixteen of $1381.17 \mathrm{~s}, 9 \mathrm{~d}$., and $4-6 \mathrm{ch}_{2}$; and that the total of these bencfices, deducting what is upon the whole allowed for communion-clements, amounts to $502,661 l$. 15 s . 5 d . and $10-12 \mathrm{ths}$; and in these, are included stipends that are not paid out of the tithes. And it is to be observed, that 65 are under the present legal minimum of $: 00$ marks, or 44l. 8 s . 10d. and 2-3ds sterling; and one lundred and cigh-ty-two have no allowance for communion-elements,-E/gin Courier.
