Canada has paid in full its subscriptions to these organizations and was not required, therefore, to make payments in 1965. It is expected, however, that additional subscriptions will be made to the IBRD and IMF in 1966 as a result of the general review of quotas in the IMF that was authorized

by its Board of Governors at the annual meeting in Tokyo in 1964.

Canada withdrew from the ICEM in 1962, but has continued to make an annual grant for the transportation of refugees.
