CANADIAN DELEGATION TO THE CONFERENCE ANHOUNCED

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Mr. Mitchall Sharp, innounced today the appointment of the Canadian Delegation to attend the Thirty-First Session of the International Conference on Public Education being held in Geneva July 1 -10, 1968 under the joint auspices of UNESCO and the International Eureau of Education (IEE).

As is normal for international conferences of this type, the Council of Vinisters of Education for the Provinces was asked to suggest the names of persons who yould join the Delegation as representatives of the Provinces.

The Delegation will be headed by Dr. G. N. Perry, Decuty Minister of Education for British Columbia, and will include Dr. T. C. Byrne, Deputy Minister of Education for Iberta, Mr. Wesley H. Janzen of the Canadian Teachers' Federation, Mr. Jean-Gilles Jutras of ACELF (Association Canadienne des Educateurs de Langue Française), and as Special Adviser (political matters) to the Chairman of the Delegation Mr. Jean-Louis Welsle, Permanent Representative of Canada at the Office of the United Nations in Eneva.

The agenda for this year's Conference includes the subject of education for International understanding as an integral part of school curriculum. The delegates will ilso consider the study of environment, and they will review reports by Ministers of iducation of participating countries on developments in education within their countries furing the year 1967-68.
