He accordingly presented the said Bill to the House, and the same was received and read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time at the next sitting of the House.

The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

1. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Seven thousand six hundred dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Civil Government—Department of the Secretary of State—To provide for one clerkship in First Division, Sub-division A, \$2,800; To provide for four clerkships in Second Division, Sub-division B2 at \$1,250, 2 at \$1,150, \$4,800, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Five thousand dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Miscellaneous—Expenses under the Canada Temperance Act—Further

amount required, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.

3. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Five thousand five hundred dollars be granted to His Majesty, for Miscellaneous—To provide for the expenses of the Commissioners, and other disbursements in connection with the Royal Commission to review the findings of the Honourable Mr. Justice Galt, for the year ending 31st March, 1918.

Resolutions to be reported.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Rainville reported, That the Committee had come to several Resolutions.

Ordered, That the Report be received at the next sitting of the House.

Mr. Rainville also acquainted the House that he was directed to move, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.

Resolved, That this House will, at its next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

And then The House, having continued to sit till five minutes before Six of the Clock, P.M., adjourned till Monday next. .
