RESOLUTION 45.

A Resolution for the relief of Maurice Caplan.

[Adopted 1st October, 1968.]

WHEREAS Maurice Caplan, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Cote St. Luc, in the province of Quebec, husband of Sylvia Druker Caplan, has by his petition alleged that they were married on the sixth day of February, A.D. 1938, at the city of Montreal, in the said province, she then being Sylvia Druker; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, on the ground of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore the Senate of Canada, pursuant to the provisions of the DISSOLUTION AND ANNULMENT OF MAR-RIAGES ACT and subject to section 2 thereof, resolves as follows:—

1. On the expiration of thirty days from the date of the adoption by the Senate of this resolution, the said marriage shall be dissolved and thenceforth shall be null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
