## SUPPLY, 1966-67

## Appropriation Act No. 3, 1966:

Two-twelfths generally of the Main Estimates plus additional proportions of 24 special items to provide for expenditures to May 31. \$ 870,275,281.00

## Appropriation Act No. 5\*, 1966:

One-twelfth generally of the Main Estimates except for the one vote for which 11/12ths has already been granted plus additional proportions of 11 special items to provide for expenditures to June 30. 450,944,478.01

## This Bill (Appropriation Act No. 6, 1966)

**Hon. Mr. Connolly (Ottawa West):** Honourable senators, the total of the main Estimates is \$8,283,224,878. Of this the statutory amount paid under the authority of various statutes is \$3,375,241,967. The amount to be voted from the main Estimates is \$4,907,982,911.

Supplementary Estimates (A) amount to \$332,441,791, no part of which has yet been voted. Supplementary Estimates (B), which are loan items, amount to \$177,027,000, and no part of that amount has been voted.

The total amount to be voted in the main and the two supplementary Estimates is \$5,417,451,702.

I think I need make no reference to payments from the Old Age Security Fund. Honourable senators are fully aware of the source of that money and the reasons for its disbursement.

May I deal now with our position in respect of supply at this moment. Appropriation Act No. 3 of 1966 granted two months' supply in the amount of \$870,275,281. That was the first interim supply bill of this financial year. Appropriation Act No. 5 granted another month's supply to June 30, in the amount of \$450,944,478.01. To this bill, if approved, will be added the balance of the amount of the main Estimates for the ten departments I mentioned in opening namely, \$825,462,-
