

maerens: see moerens.

maer-eo, ère. To be sad.

maest-us, a, um, adj. Sad.

mägalia, lum, n. plur. Little dwellings, huts, etc. [said to be a Punic word].

mäg-is, comp. adv. [akin to magnus] More, in a greater degree.

mäg-ister, istri, m. [root MAO; cf. magnus] Of a vessel: The steersman.

mägistr-atus, atus, m. [magister, magistr-i] A magistrate.

magn-ānim-us, a, um, adj. [magu-us, "great"; ānim-us, "soul"] Great-souled, magnanimous.

magnus, na, num, adj.: Great; i.e.: Large, spacious, mighty. Of sound: Loud, numerous, noble. Of persons with respect to age: Advanced. Comp.: major [i.e. mag-lor]; Sup.: max-imus [i.e. mag-simus] [root MAO, akin to Gr. μέγ-ας, Sans. mah-a, "great"; fr. root MAH (originally MAGH), "to be great; to be powerful"].

mäl-us, a, um, adj. Bad of its kind. Injurious, hurtful. Wicked. Evil, unfortunate. As Subst.: mälum, i, n. An evil, misfortune. Comp.: pejor; Sup.: pes-imus [akin to Gr. μέλ-ας, "black"].

mamma, ae, f. A breast, pap.

män-ēo, si, sun, ère, 2. v. n. To remain, continue [μένω].

man-télo, télis, n. [män-us, "the hand"] A napkin, towel.

mä-nus, uds, f. A hand. Handy-work, workmanship, work [akin to root MA, "to measure"; see immanis].

mär-e, is, n. The sea [root MAR, "to die," i.e. that which kills: cp. mors, morior: μορός = βρότος: also cp. Sans. maru; Slav. more; Celtic, mor; Lith. marios, mares; Goth. marei; Ir. muir, all meaning "sea." Others derive it from rt. MAR, "bright": cp. μαρμάρω: marmor].

mä-ter, tris, f.: Of persons: A mother. Of animals: A dam [akin to Gr. μήτηρ; fr. a root MA, in meaning of "to produce"; and so "the producer"].

mätür-o, avi, atum, äre, 1. v. a. [mätür-us, in meaning of "quick"] To hasten, speed.

mëd-itor, Itatus sum, Itäri, 1. v. dep. To think or reflect upon; to muse, or meditate, about [akin to μέδ-ουαι, "to care for"].

mëd-ius, ia, lum, adj.: Middle, mid. (Where a person or thing is in the middle; i.e.) The middle or midst of that denoted by the Subst. to which it is in attribution [cp. μέσος, μεσηγύς: di-mid-ius].

mel, mellis, n. Honey [akin to μέλιτ].

membrum, i, n. A limb, member [for membra, root MAR, "to die": see mare].

më-min-i, isse, v. defect. [for men-mén-i; reduplicated fr. root MEN; see mens] To bear in mind; to remember, recollect.

mëmör, öris, adj.: With Gen.: Mindful of, remembering. Of anger: Unforgetting, unsleeping, vindictive.

mämör-o, avi, atum, äre, 1. v. a. and n. [mëmör, "mindful"], Act.: To relate, declare. With double Acc. To call an object something. Neut.: To speak, say, declare, etc.

men-s, tis, f. The mind, as being the seat of thought. Notion, idea, thought. Disposition, feelings [Lat. root MEN; fr. root MAN, "to think"; cf., also, Gr. μέν-ος].

men-sa, ae, f. [mëtlor, "to measure," through root MEN, found in part perf. men-sue] A table. Food, dishes; an entertainment, etc.

men-sis, sis, m. [root MEN, whence men-sus, P. perf. of metior, "to measure"] A month, as a measure of time.

merc-or, atus sum, Äri, 1. v. dep. [merx, merc-is, "merchandise"] To buy, purchase.

mër-itum, Iti, n. [mer-eo, "to deserve"] A service, kindness, benefit. Desert, merits.

mër-um, i, n. [mär-us, "pure"] Pure wine; i.e. not mixed with water.

met-a, ae, f. mët-lor, "to measure"] End, limit, termination.
