HOPES FOR PENNANT

Look for a Victory Over Dreadnought Idaho.

To the navy mind there is no greater ame in the world today than the strugfor the fleet pennant for excellence battery practice, a rivalry that extends on aquadron to division, from division ship, from ship to turret, and from ret to gun. For a long time the Dreadnought Dela-yere has borne the permant, to be envisi-and loathed by the rest of the Atlantic fleet. Then, at the last battle practice, the battleship Idaho went to the ranges tiong with the champion and the rest of the fleet, and in the final count was awarded the pennant. This would never do—a plain battleship winning this trophy over the newer Dreadnoughts. What are Dreadnoughts for except to dread nothing and excel in everything?

With this in their mind, the Dreadnoughts of the Atlantic fleet have been out on the deep-sea target ranges for preliminary practice, and recently the First Division came in, and there was hardly enough room in the city for the crew of the Arkansas, particularly for that part of it which comprises the turret crew of the midship battery. Regulation Moving Target.

The practice was at the regulation target used in preliminary practice—canvas oblongs 12 x 14 feet mounted on rafts and towed at a speed of five knots an hour. As the practice was with reduced charges, the range, which with full charges runs from 7000 to 13,000 yards, was correspondingly lessened. But evan at these reduced ranges the targets seem not much bigger than the tip of a seaguil's wing. When it is taken into account that in this record firing there were three loading intervals of 16 seconds each, it will be seen that there were but 27 seconds in which to revolve a 500-ton turret and to train two 80-ton rifles for six shots from a moving platform at a moving target.
