All Banks Denuded of Gold Except Reichsbank, and People Have None.

Special Cable to The Toronto World.

BERNE, March 9.—Careful investigation among the German banks proves that they are cleared of gold, but a comparison between the amount of gold held by the Reichsbank and the amount which should be in the country shows that two billion marks in gold have been withdrawn from circulation. An appeal has been made to every patriotic German to put his last gold piece in circulation, and the appeal concludes with the assertion that the patriotic German cannot do better than exchange his gold for the second war loan stock. I am credibly informed that except the Reichsbank, no bank possesses any gold reserve thruout Germany. The income tax imposed by municipalities is being raised on an average by about 50 per cent.
