JERSEY CITY, Aug. 22.—Toronto made a winning start in their farewell series at this end of the circuit this afternoon by getting away with the long and in both contests of the double bill which featured today's line-up between Jersey City and Clymer's band at West Side Park. McTigue had the Skeeters at his mercy in the opening end, and let them down with three hits, while Crutcher was stung by Toronto for none.

In the curtain performance Brock for Jersey City, had a shade over Manning in that he held the Toronto batsmen seven wallops, while Jersey City got to Manning for 12. The latter held the whip hand, however, when the Skeeters were on the route, and only one completed it.
