Thip or ships of war whatever were sent to reinforce the said squadron, nor any recruits, nor reinforcements whatever to the said garrison till the sailing of the squadron under Admiral Byng, on the 6th of April 1756. That it appears that a greater number of ships of war could have been sent into the Mediterranean, than those sent on the 6th of April 1756.

THAT on the 30th of March 1756, and not before, orders were given for raising a company of miners, and on the 7th of May, in a letter from Mr. Fox, being after the commencement of the seige of fort St. Philip's, directions were given for sending three more batalions, for the reinforcement of that garrison.
