CITY BUYS 17 HORSES. PRICE \$237 TO \$240. In All 112 Horses Change Hands at the Repository at Fair Prices.

There was another very large attendance at Burns & Shepard's Repository yesterday, and a large number of horses were sold; also there were many enquiries from intending buyers. There were a great number of western men in attendance, who will remain until after the holidays. Nearly everything offered was sold. In all 112 horses changed hands. The prices were only fair. Many of those sold looked to be cheap. Messrs. Gunn and Broome were early on hand, and looked over all the stock that was on hand. These gentlemen are buying for the City of Toronto, and wanted none but the best. They showed considerable judgment and exercised great care in their selection. After going over

everything in the barns they selected 17 handsome horses as have been seen to gether for some time. The seventeen averaged over \$27 to \$30. This lot would weigh from 1400 to 1600 lbs. each, and were a decidedly classy lot. Chas. Lundy of Thistleton bought a handsome cream mare for \$130. A cartage company in the city bought a nice pair of bay and brown geldings, paying \$200. J. J. Walsh bought a good useful kind weight gelding for \$225. Mr. Willows of New Liskeard bought a number at prices that looked cheap. A good kind of bay gelding for \$65, an extra good bay gelding, weighing around 1500 lbs. with extra good feet and legs, for \$180; another bay gelding, a little heavier, with extra good action, for \$190, and a grand bay mare for \$197.50. One of the nicest geldings seen for some time was bought by the same gentleman-a beautiful bay gelding, black points, with the best kind of feet and legs; in fact, a show horse. For this one he paid \$250. Another bay gelding, \$145; a bay mare, \$105, and an extra good black gelding for \$122.50. A nice bay gelding, 5 years old, was knocked down to H. Dennis for \$125.50. This one was very cheap. B. Bond bought a good serviceable road horse, black gelding, for \$75. A. Boyd, a bay gelding for \$75. E. Simmins, a brown gelding for \$75. The Bredin Bread Co. got a nice delivery horse, the right kind for the job, for \$122.50. Jas. Woods bought a bay gelding, weighing 1650 lbs., a choice bay mare fit to show in any ring, a beautifully made one with extra good clean flat bone and up and dressed all the time. This one cost \$220. Mr. Williamson of Lindsay bought a couple of nice ones, a bay mare, \$197.50, and a bay mare, \$225.
