The Age Limit for Entrance Has Been by Resolution Reduced to Eighteen Years.

LIST OF DEPUTIES APPOINTED.

Many Reports Received and Adopted—A Full List of Nominations for Office.

After laboring for three days, the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd-fellows concluded all their business late yesterday afternoon, and adjourned until next year. The session just passed is in every way one of the most important in the history of the order.

In the morning, immediately after opening, Representative H. A. The recommendation to reduce the age of admission to 18 years was approved by the Grand Lodge, and its representatives were instructed to prosecute legislation at the next meeting of the Sovereign Grand Lodge.
