GERMANS' LAST STAND TO BE MADE AT MORA

Capt. Von Raba and Party of Native Soldiers Swear to Fight to Death.

BERLIN, Feb. 18 (Via wireless to Sayville).-Among the items given out for publication by the Overseas News Agency today was the following: , Captain Von Raben, who tenaciously defends the fortress of Mora in northern Kamerun, Africa, succeeded in sending a letter to Herr Ebermayer, governor of the German Kamerun region, shortly before the fall of Yaunde. The letter said that after the surrender of Garua the captain called together the native soldiers of his command, among whom were Mohammedans, and asked whether thew were ready to fight to the last or to surrender. All the natives declared they preferred to die together with Captain Von Raben rather than become pris-

An official statement issued in London, Feb. 17, said that Gen. Dobell, the commander of the entente forces in Kamerun, reported that the conquest of Kame un was complete, with the exception of the isolated posi-

tion of Mora Hill.

The German forces in southern Kamerun crossed into Spanish Guinea and were interned Feb. 6, following the British occupation of Yaunde on

Jan. 1.

HAVANA CIGAR MAKERS HIT. HAVANA, Feb. 18 .- The British proclamation prohibiting after March 1, except under board of trade license, importation of manufactured and unnanufactured tobacco, including cigars nd cigarets, is causing much uneasiness in Havana. It is feared that it will result in much distress among the cigar makers and a great loss to manufacturers and planters. All the factories are reducing their output and discharging workmen.
