your Committee promptly responded, by the appointment of a Sub-Committee on the matter. That Sub-Committee reported and recommended the supply of the Saloons of seven Steam-boats; upon which 14 Bibles and 28 New Testaments were supplied to them accordingly, the particulars of which will be found under the head of Free Grants.
