A PAPER TOWN Grand Mere is one of the most flourishing little towns in the Province of Quebec, with a population of about 8,000 people, and a business activity far greater than that of many towns of much larger size. This prosperity is due almost entirely to the operation of the big paper mill which is the centre of the town's industry. It may at first sight seem incredible that one paper mill should be able to establish and build up such a community, but those who understand how many men are employed about a large paper mill, how much it costs in general to make a ton of paper, will not be astonished. The Laurentide Paper Company which operates the mill at Grand Mere employed last year during the summer months 1,075 men. Much of their work is skilled labor, and the total sum paid in wages and salaries last year amounted to about \$850,000. Account must also be taken of the number of men employed indirectly by the Company as contractors, jobbers and workmen. These would average about 1800 a year. Now one can see why Grand Mere should be such a flourishing little community. The big mill goes on steadily day in and day out. The men can always depend on having plenty of work, for the demand for paper goes on ever increasing and the output of the mill is always rated. A paper town is always a prosperous one, and Grand Mere is certainly no exception to the rule. The activity at the mill means great activity everywhere, amongst storekeepers and hotel keepers and all business men of the town. Even in religious matters the general prosperity shows itself, and the people of the town are now bringing to completion a \$120,000 Catholic Church. And what is the real foundation of this prosperity? Just 100,000 cords of pulpwood a year, only a small part of all the wood that goes down the St. Maurice in the season. But this wood, manufactured here in Canada while all the rest goes to bring prosperity to American mills and cities, leaving little or nothing where the wood was grown.
