Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge your letter of the 11th Inst. with copy of a letter from Mrs P. O. Dee, complaining of her ^{and} children, not being placed upon the list, and in reply, have to state:—

Mrs P. O. Dee having applied, to have her two first children added to the list, the Council, on the 26th Jan'y, 1869, not only refused to do so, but erased her also, (she having been inadvertently left on the list after marriage—in the family of her mother.) as she has "married Mr. Dee, a gentleman who took her away and have been living in the States".

Your letter of the 28th Decr. 1870, instructed me to restore Mrs Dee to the list, "provided she was resident among the Six Nation people";— but she was not so resident.

Last fall, I believe, Mrs Dee became resident upon River Lot No. 61 Town-ship of Onondaga, a Reserve, to which
