The members of the Common Council are elected by a majority of the registered voters of the city of Toronto. The lists of persons entitled to vote for each ward are exhibited in the City Hall, from the first Monday in December until the day of the election (the second Tuesday in January). Persons interested should make a point of seeing that their names are not omitted or mis-spelt, as no alterations in such lists can be made unless four days' notice is given in writing to the Clerk of the Common Council of the desire to have any name altered, inserted or erased; and no one is allowed to vote whose name does not appear on the said lists. By the Municipal Act of 1849, each Ward returns but one alderman; but by the amended act of last session, from and after January next, each Ward will return two, as formerly.

The Recorder's (late Mayor's) Court is held in the Court-House, four times in each year—viz., the second Monday in January, April, July and October—the jurisdiction of which extends over the city and liberties. The mayor, for the time being, presides, assisted by one or more of the aldermen. The Police Office is in the new City Hall. The Eastern Station House is under the City Hall, where two policemen are always on duty, and can be obtained in case of necessity. The Western Station House is at the corner of Queen and John streets, nearly opposite St. Patrick's Market, where constables are also always on duty.
