## VALUABLE CARGO ON CABLE SHIPS

Have 7,000 Miles of Wire,  
Valued at \$15,000,000,  
on Board

LONDON, Nov. 3.—Two crews, drawn largely from London, are now under orders for lonely parts of the world, so that time and distance may be further subordinated in the interests of man. There sailed lately on her maiden voyage, the specially-designed cable ship, Dominica, and she is followed by the new Parady, which is making for that far-flung outpost in the Pacific, Fanning Island. Between them they have left the Thames with 7,000 miles of cable, said to be worth about \$15,000,000. They will grapple the sea with a second line of communication from Barmfield, Vancouver, to the Fiji Islands, whence a new nerve has already been laid to Australia.

### UP-TO-DATE STEAMER.

The Parady, up-to-date successor of a famous namesake, will lay between Fanning and Fiji, and the Dominica, between Vancouver and Fanning. Their work, which is only a matter of weeks, will enable the Pacific Cable Board to cope with the increased trans-Pacific traffic. Each vessel can lay her cable at an average of 200 miles a day.

As the ship is sailing, "paying out" the great new nerve, the latest instruments of science will tell experts the varying depths of the sea, which descends in one part to 3,400 fathoms, a depth equivalent to about twice the height of the Alps.

Both crews will in turn be at Fanning Island, the lonely island home of between 30 and 40 white men and women who are in the cable service. The sudden arrival of two batches of more than 150 visitors will be pleasurable and momentous events. The crews will, of course, bring their own rations and thus avert a crisis.

## DEATH DUEL IN EAGLE'S EYRIE

British Ornithologist Tells of  
Pictures of Golden  
Eagle

LONDON, Nov. 2.—Captain C. W. R. Knight, the ornithologist, has described recently how he obtained remarkable photographs of the golden eagle.

This year he went with a friend to a treeless deer forest in Scotland and managed to erect a "hide" on the face of a cliff within 14 feet of a golden eagle's eyrie. There he watched the eagles grow up, the mother feeding them, and studied their habits. Fortunately, the old eagle took no notice whatever of the whirr of the cinema camera, and he used 400 feet of film.

He filmed a tragic squabble between the female and the male eagle, which ended with the smaller eagle, the male, being thrown out of the eyrie and dashed to death on the rocks at the foot of the cliff while the mother bird nonchalantly looked on.

### CARRIED WASTE AWAY

In the eyrie at one time he saw the remains of ten grouse, six hares, and four rabbits, but when any waste food went had the old eagle would carry it away. Their habit was to gorge themselves with food and then sit and think about it. None would eat till they had cast out indigestible food, such as grouse feathers.

A heavy rainstorm dislodged one eyrie and it fell from its perch and caught in some trees at the foot of the cliff. The eagles were unhurt, and with great perseverance Captain Knight climbed to the nest and put them back into it, although in danger of having his hands torn to pieces. The mother returned and fed them as though nothing had happened.

## SYDNEY TO HAVE 75 - ROOM HOTEL

Will be Financed by Community and Estimated to Cost About \$281,000

SYDNEY, N. S., Nov. 3.—Sydney business men today embarked upon an ambitious plan to provide the city with a modern 75-room hotel, to be erected upon the site of the old Sydney Hotel, which burned to the ground in April, 1919.

After several conferences with E. A. Sturby, vice-president of the Hotel-Bureau System, Inc., Harrisburg, Pa., whose experts have been investigating the situation for several months past, it was decided to go ahead with a plan for a community-financed hotel, to cost approximately \$281,000, of which amount \$221,000 will be raised in cash by community subscriptions, and the remainder will be placed in a mortgage.
