LONDON, Nov. 3 - Two crews, drawn largely from London, are now under orders for lonely parts of the world, so that time and distance may be further subdued in the interests of man. There sailed lately on her maiden voyage, the specially-designed cable ship, Dominia, and she is followed by the new Faraday, which is making for that far-flung outpost in the Pacific, Fanning Island. Between them they have left the Thames with 7,000 miles of cable, said to be worth about \$15.000,000. They will girdle the sea with a second line of communication from Bamfield, Vancouver, to the Fiji Island, whence a new nerve has already been laid to Australia.

This year he went with a friend to a treeless deer forest in Scotland and managed to erect a "hide" on the face of a cliff within 14 feet of a golden eagle's eyrie. There he watched the eaglets grow up, the mother feeding them, and studied their habits. Fortunately, the old eagle took no notice whatever of the whirr of the cinema camera, and he used 400 fcet of film.

He filmed a tragic squabble between the female and the male caglet, which ended with the smaller eaglet, the male, being thrown out of the eyrie and dashed to death on the rocks at the foot of the cliff while the mother bird non-

CARRIED WASTE AWAY In the eyrie at one time he saw the emains of ten grouse, six hares, and four rabbits, but when any waste food went bad the old eagle would carry it away.
