RICH OLD MAN SLAIN WITH AXE BY THIEF

Martin Roughan, 80, is Discovered Dead in a Shed on Farm.

New York, Sept. 30.—Martin Roughan, 80 years old, a wealthy farmer of Bedford Hills, was beaten to death in a woodshed near his home last Friday afternoon by a person or persons who sought to rob him. The aged man's body, partly concealed beneath a rubber coat, was discovered by his grandson, James Roughan of New York, who had gone to the farm to spend the week-end with his grandfather.

It was nearly 6 o'clock when the boy reached there Friday. The farmhouse was closed, but thinking that his grandfather had gone to town for supplies, the lad waited about the front yard. When twenty minutes had passed, the boy began to feel uneasy and started back toward the house. In passing the woodshed, James saw his grandfather's leg protruding through the doorway and found the old man dead. His skull had been beaten in, apparently with a bloodstained axe, which lay nearby. Roughan's keys lay near his body.

James hurried to the nearest farmhouse, that of George B. Robinson. Then, after notifying Chief of Police George Mills of Mount Kisco, Robinson and the boy returned to the scene of the murder.

Upon entering the Roughan farmhouse they found that the place had been thoroughly ransacked. The stove pipe was pulled down, pictures torn from the wall and furniture turned topsy-turvy. Even mattresses had

been ripped open and the floor was littered with the contents of bureau drawers.

For nearly five years, since the marriage of his daughter, who now lives in Connecticut, Roughan had lived alone. He had prospered and owned considerable land in the vicinity of Mount Kisco. He was reputed to be worth about \$50,000, and there was a popular rumor that he kept much of this money in his house.

Roughan was not miserly, neighbors aid, and many tramps passing through Mount Kisco had taken advantage of the old man's hospitality to stop there for a few days. Chief of Police Mills believes that the murder was committed by some one of this type, who killed the old man when he returned home from a trip to the village and found the tramp ransacking his house. The police are hunting two men for questioning. One of these has been in the vicinity of the Roughan home for two weeks. The other is an employe discharged by Roughan several months ago.

Roughan had three children, all married.

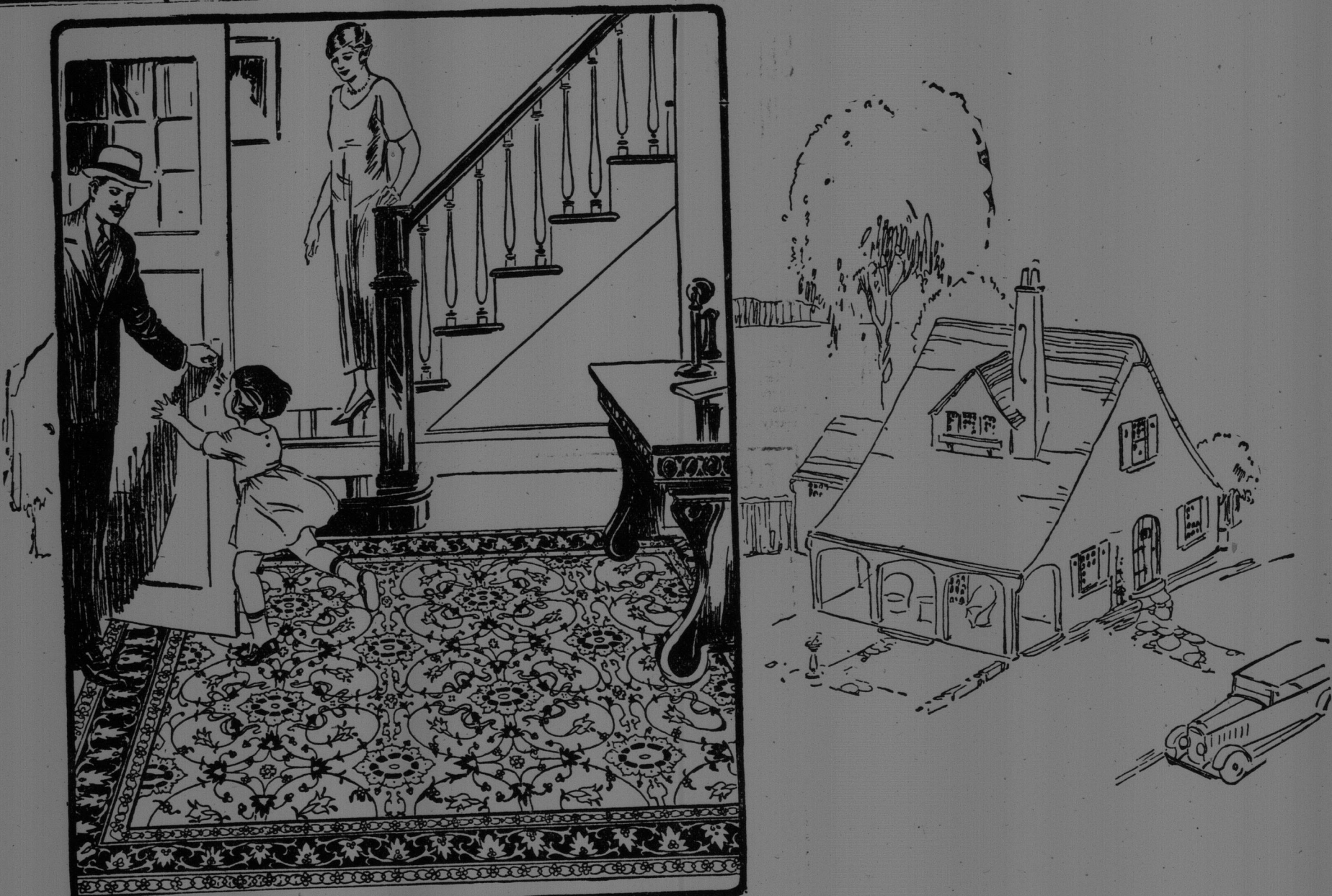
