British Treasury Statement of Contributions from Various parts of Empire.

London, Nov. 1.—(By Canadian Press) -A statement which has just been issued by the British treasury makes public the contributions of the British colnies and protectorates towards the cost onies and protectorates towards the cost of the war and states that the chancellor of the exchequer will devote such sums when received to the cancellation of the war debt. These contributions are as follows:
