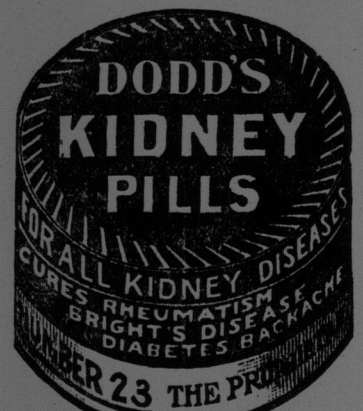

He was born in 1841, so that he is



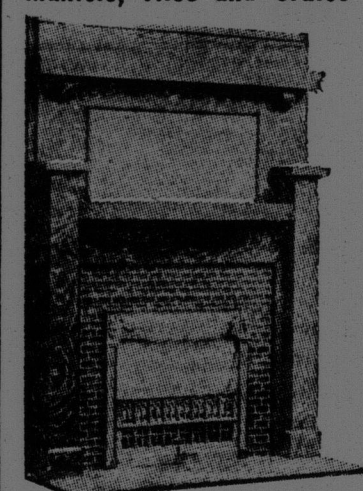
