London, April 8.—Easter over, the season may fairly be said to have settled down into its stride and from now on to the end of July the merry race after amusement will go on without a break. Even this early all the best dates have been snapped up by the prudent hostesses.

The Duchess of Marlborough will be at Sunderland House all the summer, and, besides her numerous charity functions, will give several small dinner-parties and some more of those musical evenings that were so much appreciated by her friends last year. Another duchess who will be more to the fore than usual this year is Her Grace of Manchester. Until now she has done nothing of importance in the way of entertaining, much preferring country life and the society of her own children. But apparently she has tired of rural attractions, and has resolved to give a season's gaiety at a trial. Probably not unconnected with Her Grace's desire to entertain in London is the great friendship which has sprung up between her and her husband and Manuel, the ex-King of Portugal.
