REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON HYMN BOOK.

Your Committee beg leave to report that, after they had made some progress in the work of revising and enlarging the collection of hymns already sanctioned by the Synod, it came to their knowledge that a collection entitled "The Scottish Hymnal," containing two hundred hymns, had been prepared by a Committee of the Church of Scotland, and was to be submitted to the General Assembly during the Session which has just closed.

Your Committee are unanimously of opinion that it would be desirable to await the action of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland before taking any further steps in the preparation of a Hymn Book, as it would be obviously an advantage to adopt a collection which had received the sanction of the Mother Church.
