UNIVERSITY OF ST. FRANCIS XAVIER COLLEGE, ANTIGONISH, N.S.

We are glad to publish in another part of this issue, the adv. of the Catholic University at Antigonish. In recent years St. Francis Xavier's has made wonderful strides of progress; every year marks a notable something attempted and accomplished. It will be solemnly dedicated and opened in September 1910 and 1911. All former students and other friends of the University are cordially invited to attend. New instructor in Oratory and Vocal Music. The services of Mr. Hugh William Towne, a graduate of the Emerson College of Oratory and Boston School of Expression, have been secured for 1910-11. The Lectures in Economics. The course in Economics, which was given during the past year, was greatly appreciated by the students.
