

A Suburban Home For \$4,000



This house is of the Colonial type—simple and artistic. The beautiful piazza, balcony and window effects are what give the charm. The balcony over the kitchen extension is a very convenient arrangement, and is entered by a door in the sewing room not shown on the plan. It is a good place to sit, or for children to play when the ground is damp, and may be enclosed for an out-of-door sleeping place. Reception hall is large and well arranged, with a beautiful staircase on which is the handsome window shows on the side. There is a seat by the stair platform, and a closet under the stairs. The entrance to living room is by an arch with handsome columns; also that to the library making this a beautiful suite. The library has a pretty bay seat and a handsome tile fireplace with overmantel. Both of these rooms are well lighted and arranged. The dining room has a bay, and paneled ceiling with narrow boxed beams and a plate rail. Pantry is well arranged and the kitchen a very convenient shape. There is a good sized laundry. On the second floor there are three good bedrooms, a hall room, and a sewing room. There are excellent closets, and a linen closet. On the third floor are three rooms and a bath. Two of the rooms are rather small, but suitable for single rooms for servants.

The house is frame, clapboarded with shingled roof; stone brick or concrete foundation; cemented cellar brick chimneys.


