DIGBY ALERT.

Agitation for Steel Shipbuilding.

Digby, Jan. 26.—Digby people not wishing to be behind their neighbors, are agitating a steel shipbuilding plant. It is thought that iron and steel ships can be built cheaper here than in Halifax and this town could give a shipbuilding company a splendid site for a shipyard and, no doubt, freedom from taxation for an indefinite period.

We have iron in the North Mountain within three miles of Digby and at Moose River, in the adjoining county of Annapolis, there is an unlimited supply within 20 miles of this town.

At Nictaux, about 50 miles from us, with good railway facilities, there is iron enough to keep many of the iron works supplied for a score of years.

Our lobster fishermen at Brier and Long islands are having many disputes over the nine-inch lobster law. A telephone message says that at Tiverton they are catching small lobsters and at Westport they are forbidden by the overseer not to have any in possession under 10 1/2 inches.

A strong northeaster prevails here today. Only one vessel is anchored off Digby, a two-masted schooner, which appears to be riding out the gale in safety.

The steamer Prince Rupert arrived at 11 o'clock, after a rough time in the bay. Memorial services will be held in the churches tomorrow on the account of the death of our late sovereign.

Bishop Courtney will administer the rites of confirmation at Holy Trinity church at 7:30 Monday evening.

Digby's Cornet band is progressing rapidly and will be in a position to entertain the veterans next summer with open air concerts.

Another switch board is to be placed in the central exchange before any more telephone instruments can be placed in the town. The Valley Telephone Company are evidently doing a good business.
