

Moncton, Aug. 9-The prolonged dry pell has resulted in many forest fires springing up in various sections in the vicinity of Moncton, doing much damage to wood and timber lands, as well as threatening farm buildings.

A numbers of fires are reported raging along the Moncton & Buctouche railway. Yesterday a force of men were called out to fight flames pear the M. & B. railway at Irishtown, and save the buildings on the farm of Brunswick Steeves. Rain is not only greatly needed to suppress the forest fires, but also to save the crops. There has been no rain of any account in this section in the last four or five weeks, and the country is suffering terribly from droucht.
