Will Send Delegates to Toronto.

There was a representative attendance of members present last night at a meeting of the Board of Trade when matters of importance were discussed. Like all other Boards of Trade in other centres very little business is transacted during the summer months but from now on regular monthly meetings will be held and all that is needed is good attendance of the members. However, outward activity shows the extent of the business being done.

Many of the members were real active in securing for the town 100 new houses which will be built in the near future which was a good piece of business and which was handled in a business like way. At the meeting last evening the annual fee of \$10.00 to affiliate with the Ontario Board of Trade was passed.

Will Send Delegates

Messrs. Allan Beechle and Edgar Bauer were appointed delegates to the Smith annual meeting of the Ontario Associated Boards of Trade to be held in Toronto on November 20th and 21st. OTTAWA, Oct. 31.—The sugar shortage in Canada was reported to-day to have become more acute owing to the non-arrival of new sugar from New York. The Canadian Trade Commission has taken a firm stand against further export of sugar.

HALLOWE'EN

TO-NIGHT IS HALLOWE'EN

Halloween or Hallowe'en, the Vigil of Hallowmas or All Saints Day.

Accounts of the singular observances by which it is used to be, and to some extent still is, distinguished in Scotland and elsewhere are gleaned in historic references.

Though sometimes neglected in modern practice, the most essential part of Hallowe'en ritual seems to consist in the lighting by each household of a bonfire at nightfall. This points to the very ancient and widely diffused practice of kindling sacred fires at certain seasons of the year. Some of the European countries had theirs on the eve of May 1st and others on the eve of November 1.

Probably the winter as well as the summer festival was from the beginning regarded as a season at which the fairies were both unusually active and unusually propitious; but there is no evidence to show that the methods of divination at present usually resorted to, although of great antiquity, were originally regarded as limited in their power to any day.

It is associated in the popular imagination with the prevalence of supernatural influences and is clearly a relic of pagan times. The principal object of curiosity in earlier periods in consulting the future was to discover who should be the partner in life. Popular belief ascribed to children born on hallowe'en the faculty of perceiving and holding converse with supernatural beings.
