First returned to Parlt. for present seat by acclamation, 31 Dec., 1875; re-elected at g. e., 1878, but unseated, and was an unsuccessful candidate at one by-election. CLANCY, JAMES (*Bothwell, Ont.*).

Second s. of the late Patrick Clancy, a native of the Co. of Roscommon, Irel. B. in the Tp. of Mosa, Co. of Middlesex, Ont., 21 July, 1844. M., 28 July, 1868, Emily, dau. of the late Alex. McIntosh. Is a farmer. Was a mem. of the Town Council of Dresden, and has been Reeve of Chatham on several occasions. Sat in Leg. Assem. of Ontario from 1883 to 1894, when he was an unsuccessful candidate. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Conservative.—*Wallaceburg, Ont.*

CLARKE, EDWARD FREDERICK (*Toronto*).

Third s. of the late Richard Clarke, merchant in Bailieboro' Co. Cavan, Irel. B. at Bailieboro', 24 April, 1850. Attended the National Model School there. Came to Can. in 1864, and settled in Toronto. M., 30 Dec., 1884, Charlotte Elizabeth, dau. of D. Scott, Esq. Was Mayor of Toronto from 1888 to 1892. Sat in the Leg. Assem., Ont., from 1886 to 1894. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Liberal Conservative.—*397 Markham St., Toronto.*

COCHRANE, EDWARD, J.P. (*East Northumberland, Ont.*).

S. of James Cochrane, a native of Yorkshire, Eng., by Mary Davis, of Wexford, Irel., who both settled in the Tp. of Cramahe, Ont., in 1826. B. there, 1st Jan., 1834. Ed. at Colborne, Ont. M., 1st, 5 Aug., 1856, Miss Mary Hicks (she d. 3 July, 1872); 2ndly, 26 April, 1876, Ellen Louisa, dau. of Stephen Thorn, Esq. Is a farmer. Has filled all municipal positions in the Tp. of Cramahe, and was Warden of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham in 1880. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1882. An unsuccessful candidate at g. e., 1887. The sitting mem., Dr.
