CRAWFORD, *Hon.* JOHN HERBERT. (*Kings.*)

Grand-parents were loyalists who removed from Mass., 1783, and settled on the Kennebecasis, where they remained until their death. B. at Hampton, N.B., 2 Nov., 1843. Ed. at the St. John Grammar School. Unmarried. Called to the Bar, N.B., 1868. Lieut. in Kings Volunteer Cavalry; and Secy. Co. Rifle Association. Apptd. a mem. of Ex. Council, 17 Jan., 1872. First returned to Parlt., for present seat at g.e., 1870; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal, and in favour of the free non-sectarian school system.—*Osskeag, Hampton; St. John.*

DAVIDSON, ALLAN A., Q.C. (*Northumberland.*)

Called to the Bar, N.B., 1840. Created a Q.C., 1875. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g.e., 1870. First returned at last g.e. A Conservative, and in favour of the non-sectarian school system.—*Newcastle.*

DOW, HIRAM, M.D. (*York.*)

B. in U.S. A physician. Sat for present seat
