In 1882 this Department was in correspondence with the Department of Crown Lands, Quebec, respective the proposed surveys of contain Indian Reserves on the So. Maurice River. At the request of this Department Wr. John Bignell, P.L.S. of the Province of Quebec, had been engaged by the Department of Grown Lands of that Province to conduct these surveys, and in compliance with a request from the Grown Lands Department to the Africat Wr. Bignell, received an advance of \$600, to be expended in prosecution the survey, on the 18th of September 1503.

On the 23rd of September 1854, not having heard the result of the survey which it was supposed to Bignell was making, the Assistant Commissioner of Crown Lands was written to, and requested to inform the Department of Indian Affairs what action had been taken by Tr. Signell in respect to the survey on account of which he had received an advance of \$600, asking if it had been completed, and requesting, if so, that the plans, descriptions, and field notes relating to it might be sent to this Department. In answer to that letter this Department was informed on the 26th September 1854 that we action had been taken by Mr. Bigneller
