Edmonton, Alta.	4 Oct./44	Wednesday	The Commanding Officer's weekly Parade was held as usual this morning. The good weather which has prevailed continues and it is possible to conduct on the Parade Square as usual. The shortening days will soon necessitate the holding of Parades in the Drill Hall. After the inspection of all personnel they proceeded on a good long route march which, in the bright cold air, was thoroughly enjoyed. Squadron Leader A.E.
