

With cheque.

Sirs,-

I beg to transmit herewith, cheque No. 1191 for \$3.56 in settlement of your account which is rendered at \$5.25 for express charges on a consignment sent to Dr. J. F. X. Bosse, at Bersimis, during November. The deduction of \$1.37 is due to the fact that Dr. Bosse reported that the bale (which contained blankets and which was shipped in September) was left off the boat at Bic, instead of Rimouski. This was done notwithstanding the fact that the directions on the bale plainly showed that it was to be sent to Bersimis via Rimouski. In consequence of the mistake, Dr. Bosse was called upon to pay \$1.37 for having the bale brought from Bic to the point of delivery, and the Department has re-imbursed him to that amount, which would not have been necessary had the directions on the bale been observed.
