
Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter 9th instant in further reference to the establishment of a school for Indians and whites at Split Lake.

In reply I beg to inform you that the Department is advised by His Lordship the Bishop of Keewatin that the Rev. Mr. Walter, the Missionary at Split Lake, started a school on his own account at the mission and carried it on during the past summer. It has been decided to give this school a trial and, as it is desired to send Mr. Walter a supply of school material, I have to ask you to be good enough to return to the Department the requisition which was sent you under cover of official letter of the 10th of September, last.

If it is decided to continue this school, you will be written to in regard to the attendance of half-breed children there.
