

Ottawa, June 11, 1920

Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th ultimo, and I regret that a reply thereto was inadvertently overlooked, regarding the request of the Principal of the Caughnawaga Boys and Girls Schools, to supply the material required to whitewash the fences, barns and outhouses.

I now beg to say that the principal is being informed that she may expend the sum of \$25.00 in purchasing the material and have the whitewashing done, also the small repairs required to the roof of the stable may be carried out.

When this work has been done you should forward properly receipted vouchers, in duplicate, covering the expenditure incurred and forward them to the Department for payment.
