I have the honour to refer to my despatch No.

1178 of June 14 concerning the new passport and visa
regulations of the United States.

- The Legation has, during the past week, been flooded with telephone calls and with letters asking for information about how the new United States regulations affect the movement of tourists across the border between Canada and the United States. Since it is rather difficult to deal with the written enquiries on an individual basis, I have had prepared a memorandum on the subject, which has been mameographed and is being sent to enquirers. Six copies of this memorandum dated June 14 are enclosed. It is based on information given both in the Department of State's press releases and also informally by Mr. Harrington in the Visa Division of the Department of State. Mr. Harrington was good enough to go over the memorandum before it was issued, and to state that, in so far as he could see, it did not contain any errors in the interpretation which it gave to the United States regulations.
