

- Q. Some of your Indians live here?
- A. Yes.
- Q. How No. 5 Reserve of 75 acres -- any houses on that reserve?
- A. There used to be an Indian live there but no one lives there now. He lives here now. There is no water there.
- Q. Is the land good?
- A. Yes, good land.
- Q. Is there any water that could be got for it?
- A. From the S. side of Cayuse creek, we got water up there.
- Q. But there is no water up there now?
- A. No.
- Q. How much of the land is good up there?
- A. Six or 7 acres of good land; the rest is all stony.
- Q. You said that the Government built a hatchery there?
- A. Yes, we used to get lots of salmon there; that is why we staked the land. And the Fishery people came along and they put up a hatchery there.
- Q. Where did they put the hatchery?
- A. A little E. of the Reserve and that is where they get the salmon eggs.
- Q. On both sides of the river?
- A. No, just on the one side.
- Q. This year is the only time that you have been interfered with while you have been fishing, is it?
- A. Not this year but every year since the hatchery was put up there.
- Q. According to the Schedule they have fishing privileges there (NOTE: See Note P. 89 as to the Fishing Privileges of the Indians). Now these are all the reserves you have?
- A. Yes.
- Q. And you would like to have a small piece adjoining No. 3 and another piece of No. 4 for pasture, lying E. of No. 4 and running up to the mountains?
- A. Yes.
- Q. How far up the mountain?
- A. I told Mr Graham.
