MOUNT ELGIN POST-OFFICE AND VILLAGE.

This village is situated on lots 10 and 11, in the 4th and 5th Concessions, Township of Dereham, distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Ingersoll, and 18 from Woodstock, by the main road. The village contains one general store, two blacksmith shops, one waggon shop, two shoe shops, one tailor shop, two hotels, two churches, one Regular Baptist and one Methodist Episcopal, one temperance organization, one school, one volunteer company, and the cheese factory of Mr. Wm. Harris, situated on lot 14, 5th Concession, Township of Dereham, which was established in 1867. It is 4 stories in height (frame), with stone basement, and measures 26×40 feet. Mr. Harris employs eight hands, milks 60 cows, and manufactures 20 tons of cheese per annum. Population 150.
