

Synopsis of Canadia® North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Ameria, excepting 8 and 26, not regreed, may be homesteaded by any ron who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district

in which the land is situate.

Entry by proxy may, however, be made on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homes— The homesteader is required to per-

form the conditions connected therewith under one of the following (1) At least siz months' residence

each year for three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if

the father is deceased) of the home-steader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father ce mother.

(3) If the settler has his perms ment residence upon farming land owned by him is the vicinfty of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
